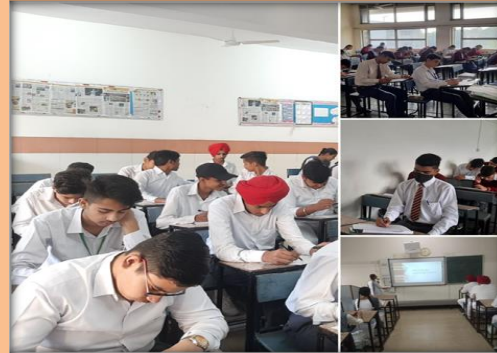
INTER-HOUSE BADMINTON COMPETITION:

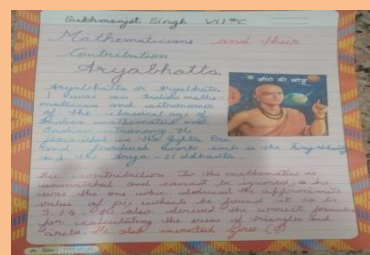
MATHEMATICIANS DAY CELEBRATIONS

World Nature Conservation Day was celebrated in the school and the objective of this celebration was to increase the awareness about protecting the natural resources that the Earth is bestowed with.

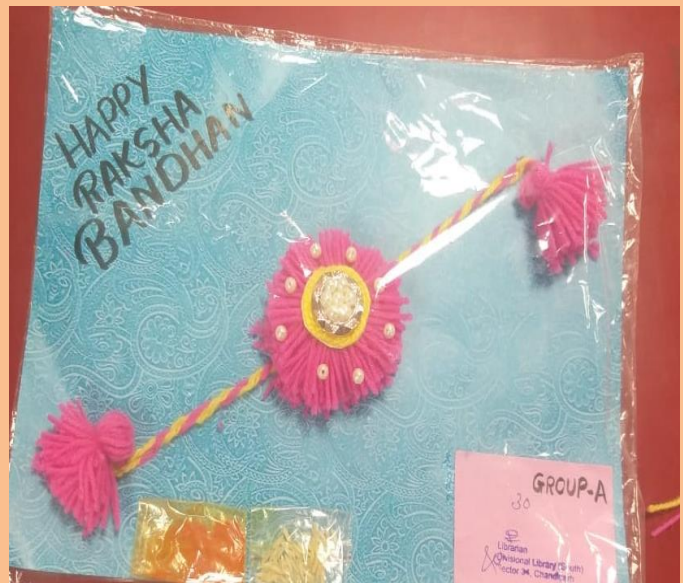

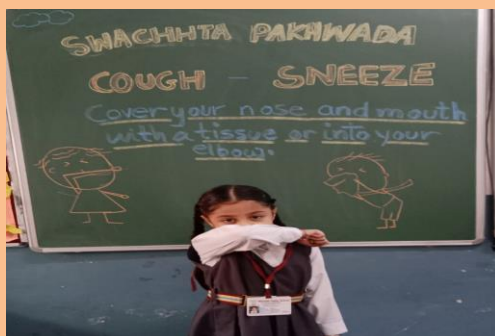
TEACHER'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

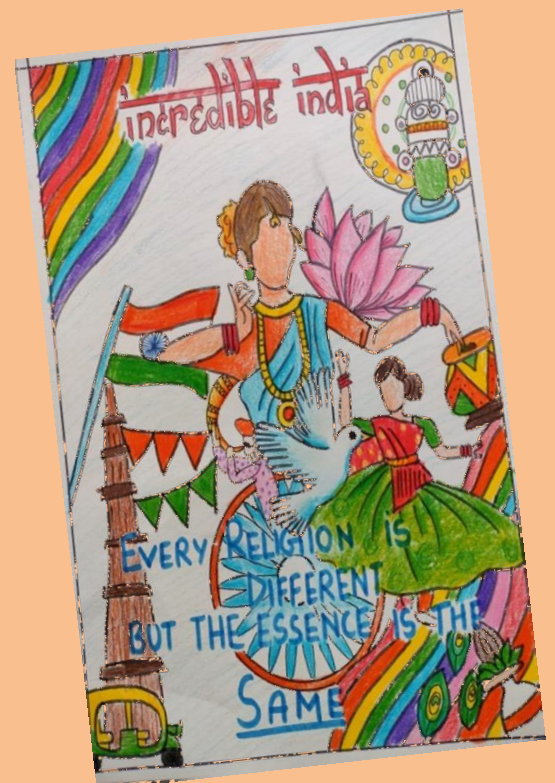
Shivalik Public School, Phase-6, Mohali
