Information was provided on the Migration Certificate, which will now be made available in soft copy after result declaration. The benefits of the APAAR ID were also highlighted, including its role in providing a unified lifelong academic identity, seamless transitions across institutions, credit transfer, and simplified verification.

The session also discussed the system of assessment and evaluation for Class XII, the availability of CBSE sample papers on the academic website, and the importance of discipline, attendance, sincerity, behaviour, and values. As per CBSE norms, students must maintain a minimum of 75% attendance to be eligible for examinations.

The School Counsellor shared useful insights on effective study practices, encouraging students to adopt

systematic planning and balanced routines for better performance in the board examinations.

The Principal, Dr. Anupkiran Kaur, addressed the gathering and responded to the queries of parents and students. She reassured them of the school's continued support and emphasised the importance of sincerity, discipline, and regular attendance in achieving success.
